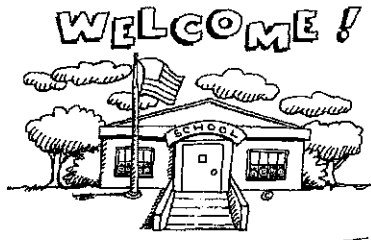

1 box of gallon-sized Ziploc bags

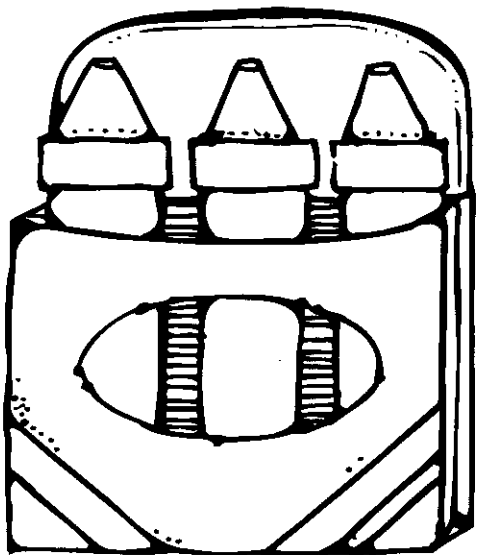
Extra Wish List

6th Grade Materials Lists

Suggested Materials List (supplies used in all classes):

- Pens (blue or black)

- Highlighters (green, pink, yellow)
- Liquid glue

- Earbuds/Headphones (for use with Chromebooks)
- 7 - Single subject, **spiral bound, college ruled** notebooks (These seven notebooks will cover your student's entire school year. Teachers will collect & store notebooks for spring semester. Although not required by the teachers, the plastic covered notebooks last longer and are more durable than the cardboard covered ones.)
- 1 - composition notebook with **100 pages, college ruled**

Information about Interactive Notebooks:

All teachers will use notebooks in their classrooms for notes, vocabulary, handouts, classwork etc. These notebooks will be for that subject only, should be brought to school EVERYDAY and taken care of. Think of them as a student textbook. Please make sure to get the correct notebooks for each class. *Notebooks help students stay organized!!*
